About the Wekiva Wild and Scenic River System Management Committee

The Wekiva Wild and Scenic River System was designated as a National Wild and Scenic River in 2000 under Public Law 106-299, pursuant to the National Wild and Scenic Rivers Act of 1968. This designation protects the river system's Outstandingly Remarkable Values (ORVs), including its wildlife and habitat, recreational, scenic, historic, and cultural values. The Wekiva Wild and Scenic River System Management Committee was established by the Act as a partnership-based group to coordinate efforts among federal, state, and local agencies, nonprofit organizations, and community interestholders.

Are you passionate about rivers, conservation, and community engagement? Join the Wekiva Wild and Scenic River System as our River Ambassador (RA) and play a key role in protecting and celebrating one of Florida's most unique and beloved waterways. The RA is a dynamic, relationship-centered position that serves as a connector, communicator, and champion for the river, working with a wide range of partners to implement the Comprehensive River Management Plan (CRMP) and uphold the Outstandingly Remarkable Values of the Wekiva River.
